About the Artist

Winner of multiple prizes, organist, pianist, and conductor, Tyrone Whiting began his formal studies as a teenager with Nigel McClintock at Croydon Parish Church (now Croydon Minster) in London, UK. Five years later, in the summer of 2011, he was awarded the Associateship diploma of the Royal College of Organists (ARCO).

Currently Director of Music at the historic St. Martin-in-the-Fields in Philadelphia, Tyrone oversees all music making at this beautiful landmark in the city's suburbs. A robed adult choir supported by four professional section leaders, a children's choir Chorister program, and a robust series of concerts throughout the year, make St. Martin's an incredibly musically active church, whose mission and outreach are at the heart of the music program.

About the Organ

The Crew Memorial Organ was built by the Schlicker Organ Company of Buffalo, New York, and installed in Herrick Chapel in 1966. The instrument is dedicated to the memory of Mildred Miles Crew (1924-1964), Class of '45. Clarence Mader, then Occidental's College Organist, was responsible for the organ's tonal design, in collaboration with Herman Schlicker. The organ has three manuals (keyboards) and over 3200 pipes, divided amongst five divisions and 59 ranks. To mark its 50th anniversary in 2016, the organ underwent a sensitive restoration by Rosales Organ Builders.
